If you have not heard by now I'm having some health issues and you may not see me as much around the social quarters but never fear I'm on top of things. Thanks to everyone who has helped me out.

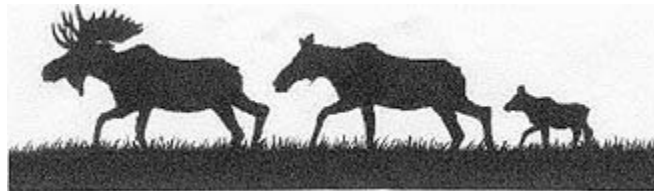
